Witherlea School is a place where everyone can feel excited, motivated and positive, from the teachers to the children, support staff to visitors, whānau to our wider community.

Donations make a big difference to our ability to go the extra mile for our students, and we are exceptionally grateful to those who are able to give.

There are many ways to pay these invoices;

- one lump sum
- small regular payments which can be organised through Val Nelson in the office (direct debit or automatic payment)
- assistance or support if some or the whole amount cannot be paid, a meeting can be organised with Andrea Harnett (Principal) to access 'funding' (we do not want any children missing out due to financial issues)

Unless either of the above options are organised it is expected that ALL other families will pay for the extra curricula provided.

We have read through all comments and many people suggested, "If the DONATION is so important then don't say it is voluntary?"

SIMPLE ANSWER: we are legally required to state that it is voluntary otherwise we are in breach of the Education Act. Schools in New Zealand are funded under a Decile Rating and Witherlea School is Decile 9. This means we DO NOT qualify for extra funding in our operations grant nor do we qualify for the School Donation Scheme which provides \$150 per student to other schools.

We are regarded among the most affluent schools in New Zealand where the community is able to support the school. Please note; if you CANNOT afford to pay the donation we do not chase you nor should you feel any guilt. If you CAN afford the donation then please pay this as our school relies on the support of our community to provide many of the extras that we believe are essential to learning but cannot be covered in the Operations Grant. Further to this, if you would like to donate MORE than the stated amount this goes towards supporting families in need to meet costs for the year.
